


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## 2 Floor maps

Whichever you choose, inform your chair beforehand, so they know how to time you.
- \* We have a projector in the room and will also be able to play sound files, in which case it might be better to keep the sound files separate and to refrain from embedding them in the presentation.
- \* You are welcome to use the university's computer in the room, in which case please store your slides/files on a USB drive or online. Please make sure to have everything on the computer well ahead of your talk!
- \* The university computer runs Windows and has Office 2016, Acrobat Reader DC and VLC Player installed.
- \* If you want to hook up your own computer, we will have VGA and HDMI cables ready. If you have a Mac, please make sure you bring your adapter!
- \* You are also welcome to bring handouts (40–45 copies should do).
